



This report the 8th Annual on 495/MetroWest **Employers** Survey includes results for both general COVIDquestions economic and 19 related questions. It is also the first employer survey for the region since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. The results of this survey reveal how businesses responded to the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as their plans for once the pandemic subsides. Overall, and despite remaining challenges, 495/MW business today remain mostly optimistic about the future of the local economy.












Businesses located in the 495/MW region generally feel optimistic about the economy despite the Pandemic.

Yes, all currently remote staff will return on-site (32.07%)


Yes, some remote staff will return on-site (52.55%)

SHIFTING STAFF TO REMOTE DUE TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC



Over half of the participants did not reduce any staff due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Nearly two thirds of the businesses moved staff to remote work due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Only one third of them will return all remote staff back on site once the pandemic subsides.

These results reveal that the COVID-19 pandemic has changed how firms operate. Most businesses expressed their intention to retain at least some staff off-site. This should allow firms to cut expenses related to office rentals, and potentially reduce the need for commercial office space. This trend may change the landscape of commercial real estate in the 495/MetroWest region.
